## Other symptoms

- Fever
- Rash
- Cough or wheezing
- Difficulty breathing
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Sore throat
- Ear pain
- Abdominal pain
- Limb pain
- Painful urination
- Injuries: sprains, strains, simple cuts that may need stitches, bruises
- Allergic reactions

### **Emergency symptoms**

- An infant less than 28 days old with a fever of 100.4 or more
- Weakness/numbness on one side
- Severe chest pain
- Severe difficulty breathing
- Slurred speech
- Serious burns
- Head injury
- Eye injury
- Seizure
- Severe cuts
- Bleeding that won't stop
- Change of mental state
